# Citrus College Receives Recognition from Engineering Council

Citrus College's new heating and cooling system has been recognized by the American Council of Engineering Companies, California (ACEC).

During their annual convention, the ACEC presented the college's Central Plant with a Merit Award in the Energy Project category.

"Our Central Plant uses state of the art technology to cool and heat the buildings on campus," explained Bob Bradshaw, Citrus College Construction Program Manager.

Bradshaw attended the conference in Sacramento and accepted the award on behalf of Citrus College. He was joined by Ivan Thomas of P2S Engineering, the firm responsible for designing the structure and submitting the nomination.

"The Central Plant was selected to receive this award because of its uniqueness, originality, and technical, economic and social value," Bradshaw said.

The Central Plant features 650 gallons of thermal energy storage, two chillers, a cooling tower, and five boilers. The concept behind its functionality is that the main mechanical cooling equipment operates at night, shifting energy use from peak demand periods to low demand periods. During peak periods, only the pump operates, providing chilled water to the buildings and meeting cooling requirements.

When buildings need to be heated, the high efficiency boilers are used to provide hot water for heating requirements.

"The main advantage of this new system is the fact that we are not using mechanical equipment during peak electrical usage times," Bradshaw said. "At the same time, the new system no longer requires separate mechanical rooms in our buildings for equipment. This allows the college to use this space for teaching or administration activities."

The \$6.8 million dollar facility was completed in June 2007 and funded by Measure G Bond money.

"The campus made a very wise and important decision when they invested in the latest technology," Bradshaw said. "This award establishes Citrus College as a campus that is energy and environmentally conscious."

# Community Services Summer Programs

**GLENDORA** — Summer is almost here, and that means a variety of programs and services will be available to you and your family. Registration for summer classes begins by mail and through the city's website. Glendora residents may walk in to register for classes beginning on Monday, June 1. Non-resident registration begins on June 8. Whether you want to enroll your child in a sports or math and reading camp, or whether you'd like to brush up your swimming-dancing skills, the city offers a variety of classes for all ages and interests.

The Parks and Playground program is geared to children in grades 1 through 5 and offers activities at the Legion Building, Finkbaker Park, the Crowther Teen & Family Center, and Williams and Sutherland Schools. Children ages 5-6 must be accompanied by an older sibling or friend. The program includes games, sports, arts and crafts, trips, and special events. There is no fee or registration required. Children attend on a drop-in basis and are free to come and go as they choose. Recreation leaders do not monitor the arrival or departure of participants from the site.
